Tips

- 4) Have students use the persuasion map to brainstorm ideas for their own persuasive writing piece. If students need additional support, provide possible topics for them (see attached).
- 5) Students can write their pieces using their persuasion map as a blueprint.
- 6) After writing their drafts, have students pair up and identify what persuasion techniques were used from the strategies sheet.
